





A COACH CALLED "THE SPIRIT OF CHARLIE"

The Spirit of Charlie Davis lives on and is presently touring the Northern Territory.

Charlie's memory has been honoured by his former employer, Edwards Bus Service, of Eden and Merimbula.

A much loved Merimbula resident, Charlie lost his battle with cancer three weeks ago, but his memory lives on through the people he touched with his insight and motivated by his dedication to service and his care for the young and disadvantaged.

In a mark of respect and love for his achievements and commitment to Edwards and it customers, the company has named its newest touring coach in his honour.

'The Spirit of Charlie' is a brand new Volvo B12 coach presently travelling Edwards Outback Safari route in the Northern Territory, one of Charlie's favourite tours. The trip is very similar to the original outback tours Charlie also established for the national carrier Australia Pacific many years ago.

At Charlie's recent memorial service in Merimbula, ABC radio presenter Andrew Ogilvie suggested Charlie's community efforts could be recognised by naming something in his memory.

However Edwards general manager Robert Edwards was one step ahead and had already arranged for the words 'The Spirit of Charlie' to be drawn above the front door of the coach.

Charlie spent nearly 20 years working with Edwards, first doing school bus runs, followed by day tours and extended tours.

Charlie established coach trips from Melbourne to the Sapphire Coast and constantly assisted Edwards as the company developed its touring market.

"Charlie's biggest value to us was in information", Rob Edwards told the News Weekly earlier this week.

"He showed me the way on lots of occasions.

"When he got sick he used to come in and say he hasn't reached his 'useby' date yet.

"Well he still hasn't.

"Charlie will live on at Edwards", Rob said.

"Charlie changed my concept of touring.

"He physically went out and did it. he didn't plan trips sitting in the office.

"He also helped alot of the drivers, especially with their commentary skills and gave us lots of checklists to make sure everything was right.

"He showed me the ropes.

"I'll always remember him for that", Rob said.

this?"


DRIVER: "No Sir."
