



GUNBARREL HIGHWAY CROSSING

In July of this year Garry Higgo & Mary Meyer ran a tour across the Gunbarrel Highway. We left Melbourne travelling via the Flinders Rangers and the Oodnadatta Track to Marla. We travelled along the Victory Downs Road past Mulga Park Station, the start of the Gunbarrel Highway. It heads west through Amata at Mulga Park, but we went through to Curtin Springs and onto the Rock.

Next morning we left the Rock via the Olgas and headed along the Docker River Road. We stopped off at Lasseter's Cave before continuing on to Rebecca Creek for lunch on what was the original Sandy Blight Road. A few Kilometres past this spot is where you again meet the Gunbarrel and turning right takes you to Giles. Now I can see why anyone who has gone from Ayers Rock to Laverton, say they have been on the GUNBARREL. All 30-35 kilometres of it!! BIG DEAL!! This section of the road is nearly as good as the Hume Freeway. Giles Weather Station was a highlight for me. We arrived there mid afternoon and had an excellent guided tour of the station, learning about the equipment and the weather. We had a look at the Mess where Len Beadell did his pictures on the wall. The grader which Len Beadell used to help make the roads and the remains of the Blue Streak rocket which crashed are also here. The following morning we went back to see the weather balloon and tracking radar take flight. I found it very interesting and to anyone who hasn't been there before, if you get the chance go.

After all this excitement was over we left for Warburton where we arrived for lunch. Warburton is a very interesting dark sort of place. Plenty of unregistered vehicles with no glass or exhaust. (Need I elaborate?) After lunch we travelled a little further before turning onto the Heather Highway. The first 40 Kms. were fine but the next 40 are probably the worst 40 in Australia. However, we managed that with a few dramas and holding of breath, as the road is narrower than the coach. We then arrived at the intersection of the Gunbarrel. The road is very narrow, corrugated and has bad washouts for a coach and trailer to manage. The vegetation is beautiful with spinifex 6 feet high. I have never seen it that high before!!

We stopped at all Len's survey trees and markers and the Gary Highway Junction before camping at Camp Beadell. The following morning we climbed Mt. Beadell. As it isn't very high all climbed and enjoyed the view and read the information including the memorial placed there for Len Beadell in May 1996, 12 months after his death. We found the water hole at the back of Mt. Beadell and continued on our way.

We got stuck in the sand which was interesting for a while. Passed some four wheel drives travelling in the opposite direction. There was a look of amazement on their faces as they thought they were pretty cool on this track until they saw us. After a few mechanical problems we arrived at Carnegie Station late that afternoon. The Station is primitive, but the hospitality from lan & Faye Smith is brilliant. They have a great place for travellers to stay over night. A good hot shower and a good nights sleep was all we needed before leaving for Wiluna. We continued to Meekatharra, the Hamersley's, Port Headland and onto Broome for a well deserved rest for 3 nights. Home down the West Coast to Perth, Albany, Esperance, Kalgoorlie and due East to Melbourne. 33 days in all and a great Experience. When I got home I said I wouldn't be in a hurry to do it again and I'm sure the coach would swear at me if we were off again soon!!

I will do it again at the same time next year, but only 16 days. Anyone who wants to come, give us a call!!
