

We got some great photos of the party on Saturday night. These will be there for all to see at the next reunion. It is amazing as to what comes out in photos!!!



A Rum Story

Phil Bourke (Philby) has recently joined Hotlinks &ndash an Internet service provider for private and business connections &ndash and advises that whether you like it dark, light, spiced or mixed into creamy or fruity concections, rum is undoubtedly the favorite libation throughout the ALDECC fraternity.

When sugar is produced, the by-products of molasses and juice are often fermented into rum. Most Caribbean rums are used in mixed drinks (such as pina coladas, fruit flavoured daiquiris and tropical punches), but a few of the best ones are suitable for drinking straight, like a fine cognac or whiskey. Some tropical rums are extremely dry, while others are very sweet and some of the more exotic ones are flavoured with local herbs and spices. Tropical rums are also frequently used in food products originating in the islands including the popular Caribbean rum cakes.


The colours of Caribbean rums vary by ho they are aged. The darker ones derive their distinctive colour and flavour from the oak barrels that they are held in during the aging process. Traditionally the best rums in the Caribbean are the dark varieties that originate on Barbados and Jamaica, but Cruzan (from the U.S. Virgin Islands) and Bacardi (from Puerto Rica) are renowned for their white rums.

Those of you who surf the web should try the two most entertaining rum sites for Bundy (www.bundabergrum.aust.com) and Bacardi (www.bacardi.com) with music, clubs, screen savers, recipes and more. You can get Bundy rum merchandise (www.ozemail.com.au/~cantbury/bundy.html) and Captain Morgan (www.rum.com/porthole.html) has a newsletter, competitions and even the Morganette of the month.

It has been over 40 years since Hazie has looked at the world without glasses!


BY THE WAY, HAPPY 50TH BIRTHDAY FOR THIS LAST JANUARY!!
