




Simone has something else to be very happy and proud about!!




"Watson, look up at the sky and tell me what you see." Watson replied, "I see millions and millions of stars." "What does that tell you?' Holmes questioned.

SOUTHERN HOLIDAY FOR CENTRE CHILDREN

Each year Central Australia is the Mecca for thousands of tourists from

interstate and overseas.

Each year the trickle of a few years back becomes a flood as more and more travellers pour into The Alice to see for themselves the natural wonders of the colorful Centre.

And each year, too, a group of Centralian kids leaves by air for three weeks' holiday at O'Sullivan's Beach, in

South Australia.

Few local committees working to raise funds for charitable organisations in Central Australia would support a worthier cause than the Centralian Children's Holiday Camp Scheme, which seeks to raise \$3,000 this year to give forty children, carefully selected without regard for race or creed, a never-to-be-forgotten holiday at the beach.


The story of this annual junior exodus from The Alice goes back to pre-war days, and is far too long to be told

here.

But in 1947 "Skipper" Partridge, A.I.M. Resident Padre in Alice Springs, saw an urgent need to revive the scheme and approached Mrs. Agnes East for help.

AYERS ROCK TOURS OUTBACK MAIL RUN TOURS

Twenty children attended the first post-war camp, under the supervision of Miss Elizabeth Ferguson, Headmistress of the Junior School of the Adelaide Presbyterian Girls' School.

The youngsters came from all over the Territory. It was wet in the Top End, and one lad rode all the way from Borooloola to the bitumen on horseback, then travelled by car to The Alice to join the party moving south by train.

Sleepers on the Ghan were not available, and the youngsters slept on their

Local residents contributed funds for the 1948 camp . . . and again twenty children from The Centre had three weeks at the beach, this time under the supervision of A.I.M. Sister Nancy Ingals, assisted by Padre Colin Ford and his wife Margaret. The 1948 camp was staffed by volunteer helpers from the Presbyterian Girls' School and Scotch

A badge day held in 1948 raised sufficient funds to purchase an old house at The Grange, known as "Warrawee." The roof leaked, but nobody minded.

Later, when the A.I.M. decided to convert "Warrawee" to a convalescent home for Northern Territory children, there were fears that the scheme would come to an end.

In 1960 the youngsters missed their beach holiday, but the following year a committee, under Mrs. East, called a well - attended public meeting, from which emerged the present Centralian Children's Holiday Camp Scheme.

In 1962 the youngsters were off again . . . this time travelling both ways by air. They had their holiday in new surroundings at the National Fitness Camp at O'Sullivan's Beach. In 1947 twenty children in need of a holiday were packed off to the beach by train, and six days were taken up in travelling.

In January, 1967, forty youngsters will fly out of The Alice bound for the beach, and it is quite likely that these little ambassadors from Central Australia, who invariably win the hearts of southerners whenever they arrive for their annual camp, will, in the not too distant future, be travelling by jet aircraft . . . a far cry from the long and tedious train journey of twenty years
