

Nostalgia Trip

Wednesday 26th August 2015 – Wednesday 2nd September 2015

Day 1 Melbourne - Clare

After 5 years in the planning the morning of Wednesday 26th August started with a prompt 7am get away from Higgo's Depot. 38 old and new faces took their seats with trepidation on what was to come. Settling in for the long day ahead to Clare old Coach Captains wondered about which roads we would be travelling on and the old cooks began swapping recipes'.
